WITTON GILBERT WAR MEMORIAL LISTED STATUS

On November 10 2019 a large crowd of people gathered around the War Memorial to pay tribute to the dead of two World Wars. In attendance were local dignitaries and ordinary people willing to brave the November weather to honour residents who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The War Memorial itself has an interesting history. The memorial was originally erected in the Graham Memorial Park in Witton Dene at a cost of £400, raised by public subscription.

Remembrance Day Service November 2019

The designer was JG Burrell of Durham. It was unveiled on Saturday 2nd September 1922 by Lt Col JR Ritson, in attendance were representatives from Parish and District organisations.

The memorial was relocated to its current position in 1978 by members of 105 Squadron, 72 Regiment the Royal Engineers. At the turn of the Century the Memorial was cleaned and the inscriptions recut.

In early 2020 the War Memorial was designated as a Grade II Listed Monument by Historic England for the following reasons: -

- Historic Interest, as an eloquent witness to the tragic impact of world events on the local community and the sacrifice it made in the conflicts
- Architectural Interest, for the strong design interest of its St. Cuthbert's Cross and the complex mouldings of its tapering octagonal column and square pedestal.

The Parish Council were happy to support the listing of the War Memorial when approached by Historic England for comments.

Parish Council meetings are normally held on the second Monday of the month in the Witton Gilbert Community Centre at 6.30 pm. However, at the time of publication meetings are being held by video link only due to Covid 19. This will continue until it is deemed safe for face to face meetings to resume.

Members of the public wishing to attend a normal or video meeting may do so but must leave during confidential parts of the agenda. Residents attending the meeting may be given an opportunity to speak but this will be restricted to 15 minutes and is at the Chairman's discretion.

Agendas and Minutes would normally be published on the notice boards at McColl's, at the top of Newton Street, at Briar Lea and on the Parish Council website but are currently being published on the website only in line with Government Guidelines.

For any member of the public who wishes to attend an online video meeting of the Council, these will be held on the same date and time as a normal meeting would be so keep an eye on the website for the Agenda. Members of the public wishing to attend the meeting must give their full details (Name, Address, Contact No.) to the Assistant Clerk by email at wgassistantclerk@gmail.com at least 3 days in advance of the meeting and will receive an invitation email with further instructions in good time before the meeting. If a member of the public wishes to take part they will need to be willing to install the necessary software on their PC, Tablet or Telephone if they don't already have it, further details will be provided by the Assistant Clerk before the meeting.

**Neighbourhood Plan
Referendum Result**

A referendum was held on Thursday 7th November 2019 to decide on the following question.

**Do you want Durham
County Council to use the
Neighbourhood Plan for
Witton Gilbert to help it
decide planning
applications in the
neighbourhood area?**

The turnout was 23% and the result was: -

- **Yes 409 votes** 88% of the total vote
- **No 56 votes** 12% of the total vote.

The Neighbourhood Plan for Witton Gilbert was therefore approved.

The Parish Council would like to thank all residents who voted in this important referendum.

Sacriston Lane Allotments

The Parish Council with the help and support of our County Councillors are continuing to do everything they can to secure the future of this important community asset

At the time of going to press the Parish Council have obtained County Council approval for a compulsory Purchase Order for the land that the allotments are situated on.

This is a very positive step forward for our long-standing allotment holders who have

backed the Parish Council in their quest to resolve this issue. The Allotments have proved a lifeline during the Coronavirus pandemic and strengthens the case to keep them as a valuable community asset.

At its ordinary meeting on Monday 8th June the Parish Council resolved to approach the Secretary of State for the Department of Communities and Local Government to seek approval for the proposed borrowing of a loan towards the cost of the purchase of the Allotment Gardens, Sacrison Lane.

Covid 19

The response of the Parish Council to the current Pandemic is as follows: -

- We have donated £1500 to an initiative overseen by Sacrison Parish Council from the Fulforth Centre, Sacrison to provide hot meals to

vulnerable residents of Sacrison and Witton Gilbert. We have earmarked another £1500 of funding in case it is required in the future

- Parish Councillors and other volunteers have been involved in an initiative to provide shopping for vulnerable residents of Witton Gilbert in association with McColls
- The Council have set up a page on their website with access to information on the Virus. It can be accessed via the front page of the website
- We are currently evaluating ways of allowing the firework display and remembrance Sunday service to go ahead in November should current restrictions still be in place
- We have temporarily suspended litter picking activities in the village but hope to return to this in July with a more limited service depending on how safe it will be to do so

The Parish Council would like to send best wishes to all of our residents at this difficult time.

COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

For those who may have missed the article in our recent newsletter, we

have committed a total of £20,000 towards significant improvements to the play park situated, just behind the primary school. The current play equipment is worn, damaged and in need of replacement, so the children have somewhere safe and enjoyable to play. This project is being done in conjunction with DCC and the Parish Council.

We arranged for the dragon teeth markings to be refreshed, this work was carried out and now they are much more apparent.

We intend to initiate some walkabouts with the local PCSO and Neighbourhood Wardens, just to clarify how things are going in the area and see how together we can address any issues

If any local sports, social or environmental groups, need funding, please get in touch and we will see if we can help. It is very important to us that children and adults have as many opportunities as possible to participate in local activities.

We regularly attend the Parish meetings and work alongside members to address concerns raised.

Last year thanks to the generosity of the village we raised £11,000.00. We spent some of that money on the toddler group, the drama group, and Breathing Space.

We also purchased a large number of pairs of sparring gloves for a local boxing club to help their children learn to box. We spent quite a large chunk of the money on two high flow oxygen units for Treetops neonatal ward at University Hospital of North Durham (Dryburn).

We also paid for an Easter family day at the club which was free to all the kids in the village, we did the same at Christmas and we also put a Halloween party on. Over the Christmas and New Year period we raised £5,500.

We spent some of it at Treetops and the rest was given to a local mental health charity If U Care Share, who we worked with last year developing a scheme for them to go into Witton Gilbert Primary School and talk to the teachers and children about mental wellness.
